From Father's desk,

Jesus shares with us "Be not afraid" and yet fear is where many find themselves for what others may think of them in reality, perception or imagination. Fear imprisons those suffering from doing many things that they are suited for or take interest in or it denies them opportunities of physical or spiritual well-being. The response that Jesus gives to us when we are in those moments of angst is found in the Divine Mercy image, "Jesus I trust in You!". He is there right at our side if we but place our hand in his and face our fears head on. Fear is a good response only when it performs its duty—to safeguard us body and soul from sin and danger, but it is not meant to become a wall behind which to hide isolated and alone nor a fence to keep us apart from taking up life, growing spiritually or being present to others or allowing others to enjoy our presence. Each of us can help dissipate unhealthy fears by taking up the Lord's call to show encouragement, compassion, and charity, not judging or becoming prejudice, seeking reconciliation and praying for one another. Let us keep our fears in their proper place and not be deprived of many joys of living, friendships that are waiting or a strengthened communion with the Lord.
