### Other Parish & Lincoln Diocese News

**THE MONTH OF ALL SOULS:** Two Plenary Indulgences one can gain for a deceased family member or friend or the Poor Souls: First, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the souls in purgatory, is granted each and every day in the Month of November, who devoutly visit a cemetery and there pray, if only mentally, for the departed.

Second, a plenary indulgence is granted the faithful who, in the Month of November devoutly visits a church or an oratory and recites an Our Father and the Creed. Requirements for obtaining a plenary indulgence: Do the work while in a state of grace, Receive sacramental confession within 20 days of the work (several plenary indulgences may be earned per reception), Receive Eucharistic Communion (one plenary indulgence may be earned per reception), Pray for the pope's intentions (Our Father and Hail Mary, or other appropriate prayer, is sufficient), Have no attachment to sin (even venial) –i.e., it is sufficient that the Christian makes an act of the will to love God and despise sin. If the Requirements are not fully fulfilled the work becomes a partial indulgence
